


In my room I have picture in my room and I found it very interesting becasuse it doesn't relate to mathematics that much but it does relate to the art side a lot. This is because there is a bunch of white lines that are displayed in the same way but it forms a pattern. It may not be clear but it has white/cream lines that sort of look like they came from the beach are connected in a curvy way. This is artistic patterns and it only repeats one design.



In my hallway we have a floor that is wooden. I found this especially fascinating because it forms tessellation. Tessellation is a repeated design that is repeated without any overlaps or spaces. The wooden floors on the hallway form a zig zag tessellation which is also a pattern.



In my parents bedroom they have a chair. On this chair and it has a pillow on it. I thought I would share it with you because a pattern is displayed in a unique way. It is sort of like a mess but when you look at the grey and white lines very closely can see a pattern formed.



Upstairs we have a garden that floats and I call it a floating garden. I found a pattern with the plants that occurs for the whole garden. On a dice the number 5 would be represented as this. In our garden I found the same this. It occurs 12 times and it looks like this. As you can see it looks like a dice.



On my parents balcony the rails that give support are formed into a pattern. It looks like leaves but they are repeated over and over several times. After every few leaves or something like that there is a pole that holds the roof of the balcony on. 
Our gate has a pattern. Brick & grout brick & grout. This is a gate/fence that has been used a lot in the outside of the house.
